
EVAN JONES 1861 – 1937

Evan, the son of a seaman who died when he was an infant, was brought up by his grandfather in Aberarth. Later Evan and his wife and family lived in Coedmore, Cadwgan Place, Aberaeron. He joined the Merchant Navy as a ship's steward and was later posted to the position of Chief Steward. He gave 40years service to Messers Campbell and Co. of Glasgow serving both on their sailing ships and steamers.

His fingerprints were also included beneath his signature Entries in Evan Jones's Merchant Navy Handbook list some of the ships he sailed on such as S.S. Kara Reg 1114 tons, S.S Dalblair 2999 tons, Beumoth Leith 2999 tons. He visited such places as Antwerp, Rotterdam, China, Japan, Mauritius and Mexico and Australia. He also sailed to the West Indies on 10 occasions.

On their marriage certificate Hannah's address was given Pier Cottage, although she was originally from the Lampeter area. Her mother was the daughter of Coedmor Fawr, the origin of the name of the house in Aberaeron.

Evan Jones died in 1937 at the age of 74 years of age. He died suddenly in his allotment garden in Aberaeron. His funeral service took place in Tabernacle, several Aberaeron citizens attended together with all his family bar his son Timothy Jones who was serving on sea
